

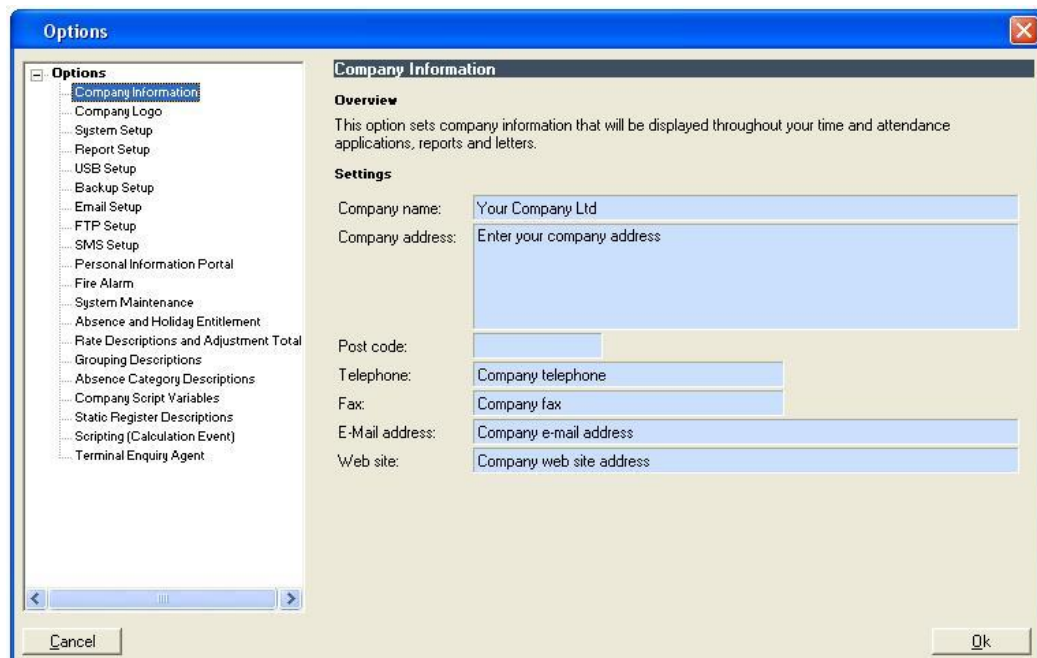

'Advanced options...'

1. Click on the Advanced menu and select Options.

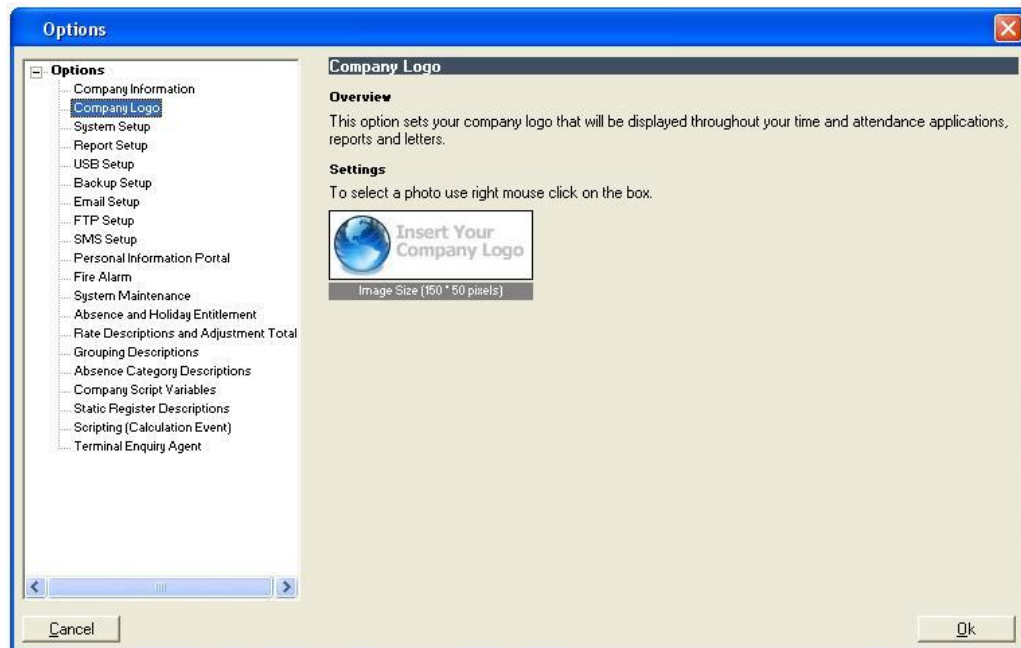


2. Select Company Information and complete the fields.

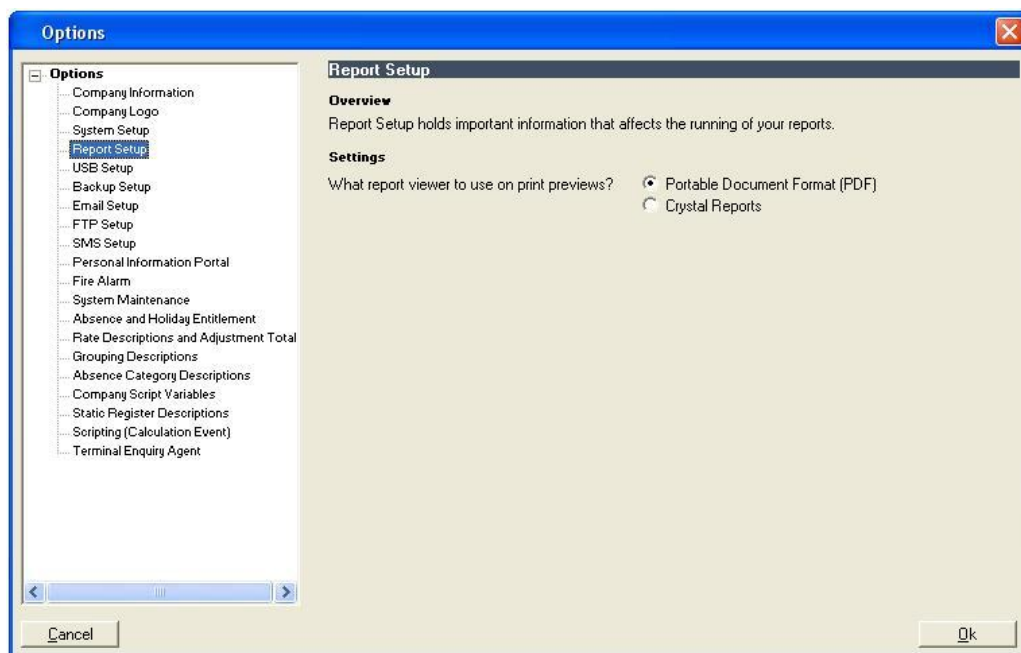




3. Select Company Logo and assign the logo.



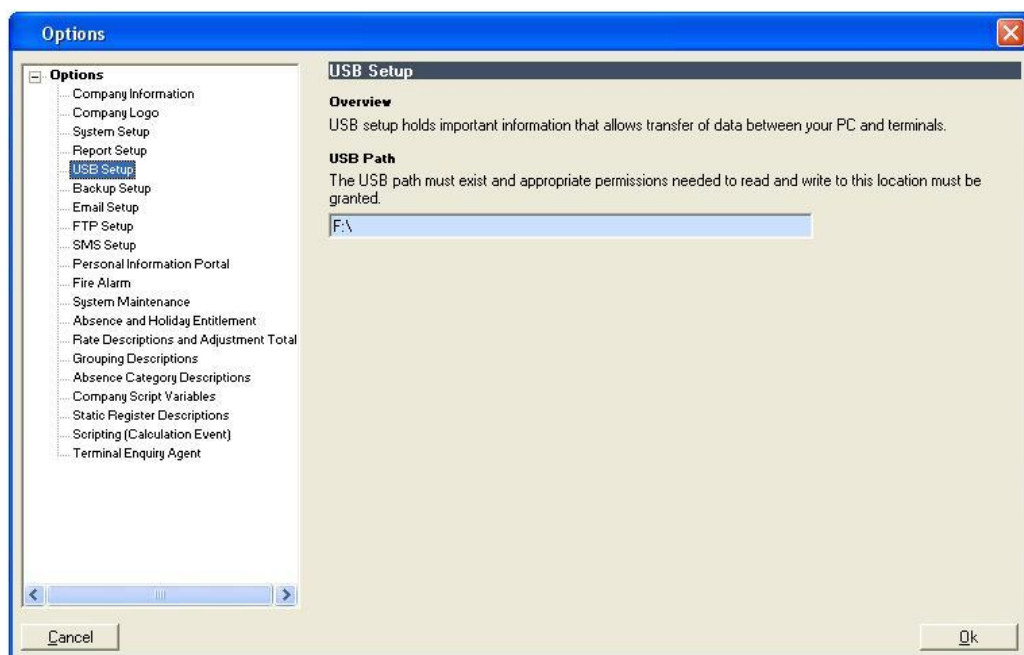
4. Select Report Setup and choose the report viewer.





Please note that this option need only be completed if you are using terminals with integrated USB ports.

5. Select USB Setup and select the USB Path.





6. Select Backup Setup and specify the timeware® client Backup Folder, (this is relative to the database server).

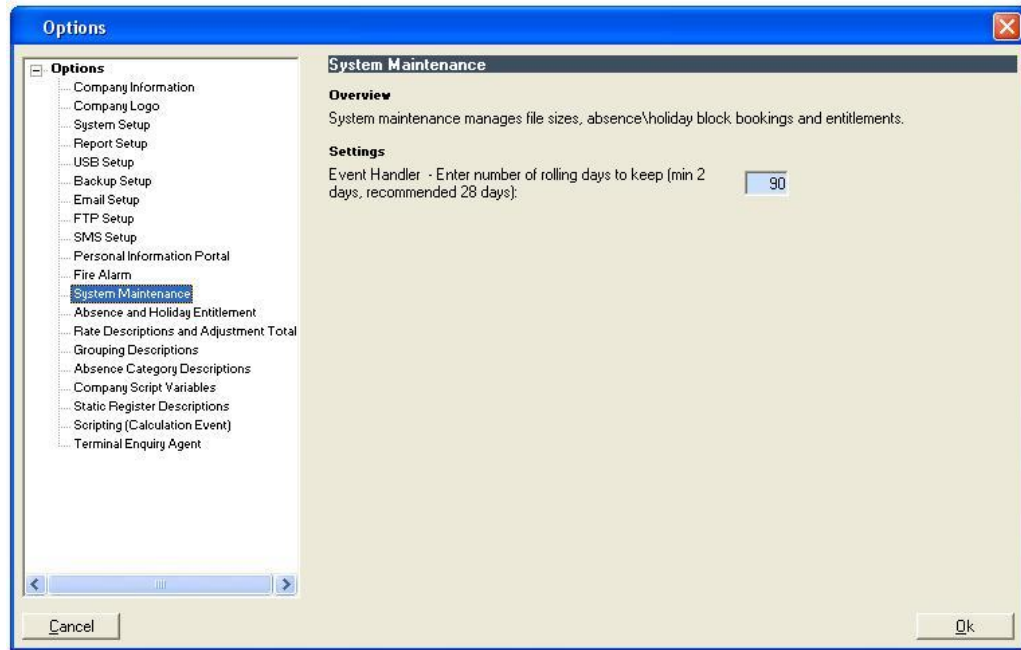
9. Select SMS Setup and complete the fields.

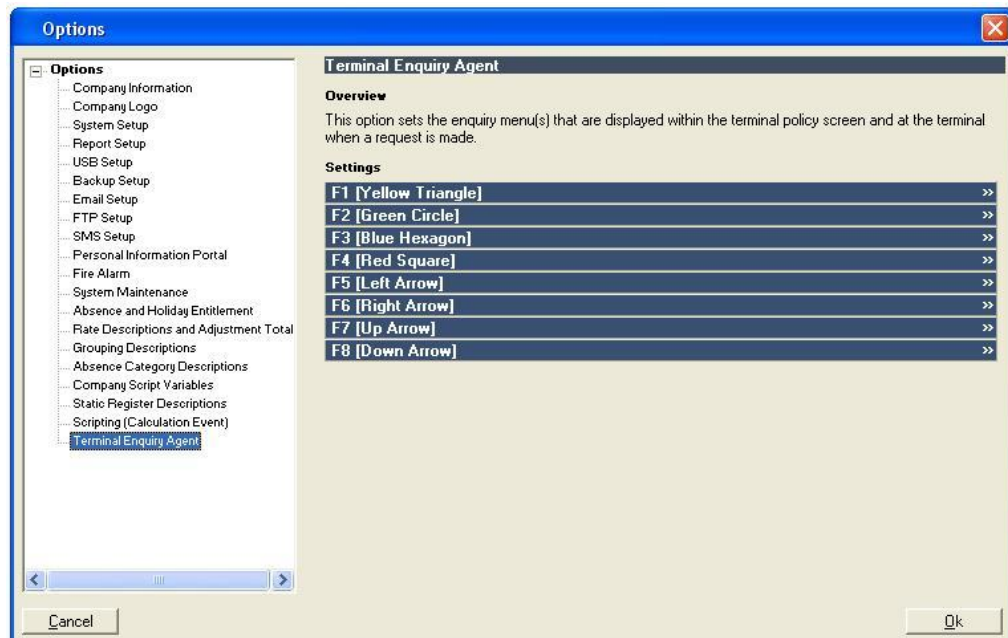

10. Select System Maintenance and enter the number of rolling days.

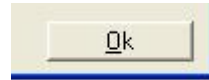


11. Select Terminal Enquiry Agent and complete the fields.
